In addition, since the beginning of this school year we brought on a general ed consultant to help us build out our curriculum map, the 4-5 class had their first sleep away camp experience, three of our ninth graders attended the PNAIS leadership conference on diversity, the school added new sports teams and we launched a Science Fair. APL IS LAUNCHING A HIGH SCHOOL

APL is proud to announce APL High School, beginning with the 9th and 10th grades next year, (2013-2014). We will add a grade per year in the following years, so that we will be a 9-12 school by 2015. Each class will enroll 16 students, taught by a Head Teacher and Assistant Teacher, with Instructional Assistants and a Board Certified Behavioral Analyst (BCBA) working with each student, according to the APL model, as needed. APL High School will provide a high quality and individualized education for students with Autism as well as their typically developing peers within an inclusive and socially vibrant environment. APL High School will provide education that will be molded to the individual students’ post-secondary goals, whether that includes college, vocational plans, or transition services, so that each student is supported to reach his/her full potential.

We will work in cooperation with Yellow Wood Academy (formerly ETC) and Aspiring Youth to create a high quality educational and social program that will cater to the whole child. Yellow Wood Academy has been an accredited High School for over 20 years. Yellow Wood will add quality to the program by providing advanced class instruction (such as Geometry and Science Administrative Assistance, Transcript Creation and Monitoring, Academic and College Guidance and Curriculum Management). We are excited to provide this unique professional partnership with Yellow Wood Academy which adds so much to APL High School!

Aspiring Youth provides Social Skills education to teens in a positive and supportive environment. Aspiring Youth will facilitate social interaction between our students in the High School in a variety of different ways. These include a Social Skills curriculum which will be shared by the students as well as physical exercise, games, and field trips. This social skills curriculum will benefit all of the learners

including parent groups, speaker series and fun community fundraising activities! As you can see, across our academic program, enrichment activities, and community experiences – it has been a busy and very productive year.

But we're not done yet! This is always such a wonderful time of year at the school with high energy all around. The students are focused on meeting their individual goals, our after school clubs and Spring sports teams are in full swing, and we still have several musical productions to host. Personally, it is very rewarding to see all of our students thriving and the staff operating at such a high level.

As always, the ongoing support we receive from our extended community is essential to our success. We thank you for being a part of the APL family and helping us continue to grow and thrive.

CLINICAL UPDATE

ROOTS (APL's behavioral consultation team) is hard at work this Spring completing post-testing! This rigorous assessment process involves completing the Woodcock Johnson Tests of Academic Achievement III (the WJ-III for short) with each student at the end of each school year to measure yearly academic progress relative to same-age peers. The test results also give us more information for planning instruction next year. 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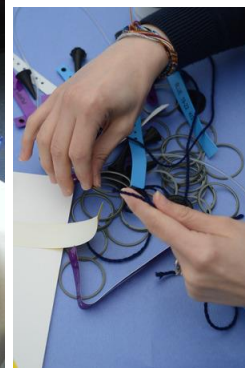
